## ORDER

Pursuant to N.D.N.Y.L.R. 7.1(b)(2), defendants Timothy M. McGinn and David L. Smith filed requests for leave to file nondispositive motions to (1) suppress evidence pursuant to the Second Circuit's recent decision in S.E.C. v.
